Summer Camp and Trek Dates

Most units arrive a day early on Saturday for summer camp
Trek crews should plan on arriving on Saturday

Fee Type	Amount
Scout Early - Paid in full by 4/30/2015	\$371
Scout Regular - Paid after 4/30/2015	\$409
Site deposit	\$250
Additional adult leaders	\$130

- ◆ Early deadline for graduating Webelos is 5/31/2015
- ◆ Non-refundable site deposit will be applied to the troop's total 2015 camp fee
- ◆ Two free leaders for the first 18 Scouts. One extra free leader for every 9 additional Scouts.

Adirondack Trek Fees

New per person fees for treks with more than 7 people

Fee Type	Early
Hiking trek (includes up to 7 people)	\$2,900 per trek
Canoeing trek (includes up to 7 people)	\$3,100 per trek
Extra person (up to 10 people total)	\$400 per person

- ◆ A \$650 non-refundable deposit reserves a trek
- ◆ 2nd non-refundable payment of \$850 is due 1/16/2015
- ◆ Deposit and 2nd payment are applied to total fee
- ◆ Final balance must be paid by 4/30/2015
- ◆ Late fee is \$50 per person for payments after 4/30/2015
- ◆ Hiking treks are limited to 7 people
- ◆ Canoeing treks can have 7-10 people, depending on the trek
- ◆ Treks that use canoes for all or part of the trek are considered canoeing treks

Multiple Week and Sibling Discount

\$50 discount for additional weeks at camp

The first week at camp for a family is at the early or regular fee. Take \$50 off of additional full weeks at camp.

- ◆ Applies to all Patriots' Path Council camps for Boy Scouts. Includes troop resident camps and camps for individuals.
- ◆ Applies to siblings and multiple weeks by one Scout
- ◆ Excludes Cub Scout camps and Adirondack Treks

Have you tried an Adirondack Trek?

In addition to resident camp, Sabattis also offers weekly high adventure treks in the six million acre Adirondack Park. Choose from canoeing, hiking or fishing treks. There are 46 mountains over 4,000 feet tall, 1,500 miles of hiking trails and 1,000 miles of canoe routes. Begin and end your trek at Sabattis Adventure



Camp. You put together a crew including at least one adult 21 or over. We provide top notch equipment (including **ultralight Kevlar canoes**), food, and a trained **Adirondack Voyageur** guide.

All treks require a minimum of 7 participants. Many canoe treks can have up to 10 participants. We also offer a limited number of **7 person Wilderness Canoe treks**. These are perfect for those who want to visit more remote locations, where the group size is restricted to 8 people.



Hiking treks are limited to 7 people. Treks are conducted in accordance with the Outdoor Code and the Leave No Trace philosophy to ensure a trek that will be both educational and fun.

Ask about our **Watchu Sabattis Adirondack Treks** that combine an Adirondack trek in 2015 with a Philmont trek in 2016.

Scouts, Venturers and adult advisors all love our Adirondack Treks. The memories will last a lifetime!


What about camps for individual Boy Scouts?

Sabattis Adventure Camp



Sabattis Adventure Camp is located in the heart of **New York's Adirondack Park**, in the hamlet of Long Lake.

The camp encompasses 1,250 acres surrounded by wilderness and includes a 250-acre crystal clear lake. Sabattis' unique program offers **merit badges and skill instruction in the morning and lots of fun open activities in the afternoon.**



Sabattis is located about five and a half hours from New Jersey and fifty miles from Lake Placid. Ask about coach bus service from New Jersey.

Patrol Style Cooking gives Scouts the opportunity to work together and polish their cooking, camping and leadership skills. At each meal, every patrol sends two Scouts to pick up their meal ingredients from the commissary. Meal preparation directions are included. No cook options are available for breakfast and lunch.



Large Private Campsites — many are on the lake — provide an awe inspiring location for your unit's summer camp. Wake to the sounds of loons calling across the lake. See wildlife, try the polar bear swim or take in the view from Charley's Mountain.

Each campsite includes a water spigot, a latrine with a washstand, a flag pole, a bear proof storage box and a bulletin board. Patrols are provided with a picnic table, a dining fly, a patrol box, 3 tubs for dish washing, and a burn barrel. You provide your own tents, cooking gear and other desired unit and patrol equipment.



Need Financial Assistance to send your son to camp? Patriots' Path Council can help. The Warren Wheeler Adventuershhip is available for families to help pay the cost of attending our camps. The deadline is 4/1/2015.

Our **Aquatics** area offers merit badges plus open swimming, boating, canoeing, sailing, kayaks, and funyaks. Other programs include the morning polar bear swim, 30' War Canoes and snorkeling.

The **Archery** range has Archery merit badge, open archery, open field archery, and the Robin Hood award.

Campwide Events include an opening campfire, evening campwide games, a water carnival or Paul Bunyan field day on Friday afternoon, and a closing campfire.

The **Climbing** area features Climbing merit badge, open climbs on the tower, rappelling, spar pole climbing, and the BSA Climb on Safely course.

COPE - Challenging Outdoor Personal Experience consists of both low and high course elements. Activities foster team building and test individual skills and agility.

Ecology/Conservation includes merit badges, survival games, conservation projects, **Charley's Mountain** day and overnight hikes, fishing, stargazing, a twilight canoe trip, an **overnight mini canoe trek** on Bear Pond, and a nature trail that traverses multiple ecosystems.



Shooting Sports include Rifle and Shotgun Shooting merit badges, open shooting, **.30-06 rifles** and muzzle loading.

First year Scouts can have fun while working on advancement including several merit badges in our **Dan Beard Program**.

Learn how the 1800's **Mountain Man** survived some of America's most treacherous but beautiful territories. Try our **Buckskin Games** including tomahawk and knife throwing.



Experience the thrill of **Mountain Boarding** on our hills and trails. **Mountain Biking** is available on the camp trails and out of camp to Lake Lila, and Sabattis Station.

Scoutcraft offers several merit badges, a wilderness survival overnight, outdoor cooking demonstrations, Totin' Chip, Firem'n Chit, and wood carving and fire building contests.

The **Health Lodge** provides First Aid merit badge classes, CPR training and a resident health officer. Our **Trading Post** features snacks, drinks, souvenirs, merit badge pamphlets, and basic camping equipment.

Geocaching is fun for all and the **Guild of the Barkeater Award** is a challenge for adult leaders.

Out of Camp Activities you may want to try include: the Adirondack Museum in Blue Mountain Lake, float plane rides, Lake Placid - home of the 1932 and 1980 Winter Olympics, the Woodsmen Lumberjack Competition in Tupper Lake, and climbing some of the 46 Adirondack high peaks.
